

Acts of the Apostles Chapter 6 : Seven Deacons Chosen to Serve

Now in those days, when the number of the disciples was multiplying, there arose a complaint against the Hebrews by the Hellenists (Greek speaking Jews) because their widows were neglected in the daily distribution. 2 Then the twelve summoned the multitude of the disciples and said, "It is not desirable that we should leave the word of God and serve tables. 3 Therefore, brethren, seek out from among you seven men of good reputation, full of the Holy Spirit and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business; 4 but we will give ourselves continually to prayer and to the ministry of the word." 5 And the saying pleased the whole multitude. And they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, and



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Text: John 6:1-14 Feeding the Five Thousand After these things Jesus went over the Sea of Galilee, which is the Sea of Tiberias. 2 Then a great multitude followed Him, because they saw His signs, which He performed on those who were diseased. 3 And Jesus went up on the mountain, and there He sat with His disciples.4 Now the Passover, a feast of the Jews, was near. 5 Then Jesus lifted up His eyes, and seeing a great multitude coming toward Him, He said to Philip, "Where shall we buy bread, that these may eat?" 6 But this He said to test him, for He Himself knew what He would do.7 Philip answered Him, "Two hundred denarii worth of bread is not sufficient for them, that every one of them may have a little."8 One of His disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said to Him, 9 "There is a lad here who has five barley loaves and two small fish, but what are they among so many?"10 Then Jesus said, "Make the people sit down." Now there was much grass in the place. So the men sat down, in number about five thousand. 11 And Jesus took the loaves, and when He had given thanks, He distributed them to the disciples, and the disciples to those sitting down; and likewise of the fish, as much as they wanted. 12 So when they were filled, He said to His disciples, "Gather up the fragments that remain, so that nothing is lost." Therefore, they gathered them up, and filled twelve baskets with the fragments of the five barley loaves, which were left over by those who had eaten. 14 Then those men, when they had seen the sign that Jesus did, said, "This is truly the Prophet who is to come into the world." Amen



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Apostolic Pastoral and Apostolic Teaching Apostle reminds us that Our Lord promised a special gift in John 14:27 "Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth, give I unto you. Let not your heart be troubled, neither let it be afraid". Under the Jewish law a voluntary thanksgiving offering could only be made after a peace-offering. Christ fulfilled the law, has given us His peace and this now enables us to offer thanksgiving at all times. Ephesians 5:20 "Giving thanks always for all things unto God and the Father in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ". 
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This Bible given to you today is a sign of your authority as a Deacon. Matthew (24:35), our Lord teaches that: *Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my words shall not pass away.*

OBLIGATION AND DECLARATIONS

In the Holy Scriptures, we read that Deacons are called to work with the Apostles, Bishops, Elders and the Priests with whom they serve as heralds of Christ's kingdom. They are to proclaim the gospel in word and deed, as agents of God's salvation plan. They are to serve the community and work with their fellow members in searching out the poor and weak, the sick and lonely and become instruments of God's all-embracing love. Deacons therefore firstly share in the pastoral ministry of the Church and in leading God's people in worship through the preaching on the Word of God. As a Deacon, you are at all times to assist the Altar Servants in preparing the communion table and administering the sacraments. Deacons are called by God to help with the day-to-day work of the Church, assist in exceptional circumstances with the consecration of the Sacraments, and must always be obedient to those Altar Servants whom they assist. Deacons are to teach from the Holy Scriptures only, guided by the Apostle's pastorals and teaching as received from time to time. It will be your responsibility to read these with God's people, so that the whole Church may be equipped to live out the gospel in the world. Deacons are to be faithful in prayer, esteeming others more than yourself. We, as your brothers and sisters, through the grace of God, will endeavour to support you in the fulfilment of the duties of your office. Open the Bible at the Acts of the Apostles Chapter Hold it open in your left hand and place your right hand over it.

CONFERRING PRIESTLY RITE OF CONSECRATIONON ON A DEACON

We now recall the night of our Lord's betrayal as recounted by Apostle Paul in 1 Corinthians 11: 23-26, who said that: 23 For I have received of the Lord that which also I delivered unto you, that the Lord Jesus the same night in which he was betrayed took bread: 24 And when he had given thanks, he brake it, and said, Take, eat: this is my body, which is broken for you: this do in remembrance of me. 25 After the same manner also he took the cup, when he had supped, saying, this cup is the new testament in my blood: this do ye, as oft as ye drink it, in remembrance of me. 26 For as often as ye eat this bread, and drink this cup, ye do shew the Lord's death until he come. In the absence of the Priest of this community, and whenever called upon to do so, you are given today access to the Priestly Rites of Consecration of Holy Communion. This is only to be used when the Priest of the community is absent. It remains the Priest's responsibility to ensure that enough consecrated Holy Communion is available. Remember, all are welcome at the Lord's Table. Never put that plate and or cup down, but always have them in your hands.

ANNOINTING WITH BLESSED OIL

Ordaining Officer assisted by other officers, standing behind him with their hands on his shoulders, and one another's shoulders, dips his finger in the blessed oil and anoints the head of the new officer three times with the sign of the Holy Cross while saying:

With this oil, I anoint you as Deacon in the name of God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Ghost, Amen.

Remember the words of the Apostle Paul who said (Hebrew 12:1-3):

Let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which doth so easily beset us, and let us run with patience the race that is set before us, Looking unto Jesus the author and finisher of our faith; who for the joy that was set before him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God. For consider him that endured such contradiction of sinners against himself, lest ye be wearied and faint in your minds.

SACRED RITE OF ORDINATION TO THE DEACON OFFICE "The

Holy Ghost comes upon thee, and the power of the Highest overshadow thee, Amen" (Luke 1: 35)."

Our Lord spoke and said (Matthew 11:28-29), "Come to Me, all you who labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest. Take My yoke upon you and learn from Me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.

As a servant in the House of GOD (place hands on the right shoulder of the new officer), sent and ordained by an Apostle of Jesus Christ, do I come now and ordain you, by instruction of an Apostle of Jesus Christ, as a Deacon called by God to be a servant unto His people.

Receive the yoke of the Deacon office, which I lay in this day in your heart with fire and power given to that office to teach and serve the people of God in humility and love. By taking on his yoke, you submit to his authority alone. Look towards Christ, the author and finisher of our faith and learn from Him. In this day, He accepts you as a willing servant, however imperfect you are. His commandments are holy, just, and good.

In this day, our brother Deacon, do we also pray that the Lord will open your understanding to read and interpret the Word of God, so that none of God's children may be in want and that you will always seek to care for the least, the lost and the last.

Our Lord taught (Mark 9:35), And he sat down, and called the twelve, and saith unto them, If any man desire to be first, the same shall be last of all, and servant of all.

Remember, he who is the foremost will become the least, and the least of all servants will become the foremost. Amen

5. Have staunch and genuine soul-love to all, without any distinction. 1 Peter 1:22


