Lesson 2: What do we as Apostolic Christians believe? We look at the first point in our confession of our faith

1. “We believe in God the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and Earth.”

In the Book of Genesis, the first book in the Bible, we read right at the beginning of God’s marvellous and loving creation and that He made it all Good.

This means that we believe and know that:

- Every person is unique and made in the image of God.
- As His Creation, He blew the breath of life into us and all of His creation.
- Being made in the image of God, gives us all human dignity which tells us that we are not just something, but someone.
- The most valuable stamp is the stamp of which there is only one off. God made us all to be that one important stamp.


Catechism Question Number 1: How did the Earth & Heavens we see and all animals, birds, fishes and vegetation come into existence?

Answer: It was all created by the Almighty God from nothing, by His powerful word, in the space of six days in His time, and all was very good.
